T.H.I.N.K. Ambassador requirements:

- 1) Read the following two books:
 - Escape from Camp 14 by Blaine Harden
 - Aquariums of Pyongyang by Cheol Hwan Kang
 - Other suggested books:
 Nothing to Envy by Barbara Demick
 Escaping North Korea by Mike Kim
- 2) View the Documentary:
 - Kimjongilia or Seoul Train
- 3) Attend at least 3 seminars held by KAC THINK program with experts:
 - Stephan Haggard, UCSD professor
 - David Kang, USC professor
 - Cheol Hwan Kang, NK Strategy Center
 - Philip Yun, Ploughshares
 - Sydney Seiler, White House National Security- NK Director
 - Agency NK experts from Global Resources and/or Mercy Corps
- 4) Complete a T.H.I.N.K. Project of your own choosing to help spread the information and increase awareness of the plight of North Koreans.
- 5) Pass a written and oral examination to show that they are capable Ambassadors for T.H.I.N.K.

T.H.I.N.K. Ambassadors will have the opportunity to meet and converse with prominent figures, such as the U.S. Ambassador to the Republic of Korea, Honorable Sung Kim and Honorable Young Jin Choi, the current Republic of Korea Ambassador to the United States, about the main issues affecting North Korea.

There will be an application fee of \$250, which includes three books and all speaker training sessions.
